While the global pandemic has in some cases returned to a sense of normalcy, the sports industry has continued to experience "less than normal" circumstances: playing in front of partially-empty stadiums, adjusting to new safety protocols and testing, limited funding and sponsorship, and few opportunities for in-person development and trainings.

WeCOACH has navigated the past 18 months of uncertainty with grace, resilience, and remained at the forefront in providing first-in-class virtual programming and content to our community of women coaches. As most 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations could attest, the waters have been rocky, but in a time when our membership needed it most, WeCOACH stayed steadfast in our quest to better support, educate and serve women coaches women coaches of all sports and levels.

We have continued to emphasize our premier programming, which includes:

- BreakThrough Summit, which generated a 200% increase in registrants and 400,000+ Twitter impressions during the live event
- The NCAA Women Coaches Academy, our longstanding premier event, was hosted again virtually in May 2021 and represented our 50th class of graduates.
- WeCOACH hosted the first-ever virtual High School Women Coaches Leadership Academy with 80+ women coaches represented across 28 states
- Progressing diversity and inclusion through the work of our WeAMPLIFY initiative, which focuses on amplifying the voice, presence, and experiences of women of color in the coaching community.

WeCOACH/ NCAA WOMEN COACHES ACADEMY & ACADEMY 2.0

The Academies are offered annually in May.



The NCAA Women Coaches Academy (WCA), hosted in partnership between WeCOACH and the NCAA, is a multi-day educational training available to NCAA Division I, II and III women coaches of all sports. The WCA is designed for women coaches who are ready and willing to increase their individual effectiveness by learning advanced skills and strategies that directly affect their personal and team success.



Academy 2.0 is a next-level 3-day training available to graduates of the NCAA Women Coaches Academy.

HIGH SCHOOL WOMEN COACHES LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

Modeled after our longstanding premier NCAA Women Coaches Academy, this 2-day virtual program is aimed at providing leadership and educational programming to assist high school level women coaches in reaching team and individual success. The first and only of its kind in the nation, this new program will encourage women at the high school level to stay in the profession by providing education, inspiration and connection.



BREAKTHROUGH SUMMIT



BreakThrough Summit is a free, digital leadership summit designed to develop, inspire and celebrate women in sports. Co-hosted with Hudl, our collective mission to fight against systemic racism, injustice and gender inequality is evidenced by the relevant topics, speakers and sessions we feature in the annual Summit. The Lifetime Achievement Award presented by Jostens is also awarded live during the Summit.

WeCOACH acknowledges the importance and value of including specific programming for women coaches of color in our WeCOACH community. WeAMPLIFY was created to drive change and conversation surrounding social and institutional barriers.
