The IWG World Conference on Women & Sport is the largest gathering in the world to advance gender equity and equality in sport and physical activity. The presentation titled *The Value of and "How To" of Women Only Coach Education: Learnings from the USA & Japan,* will bring together learnings and findings from years of collaboration between these five industry leaders.

Additionally, in 2014, Ogasawara attended the premier WeCOACH/NCAA Women Coaches Academy (WCA) with the intent to launch the Japanese Women Coach Academy. Now in its 7th year and on the heels of the Tokyo Olympics, the Japanese Women Coach Academy, modeled after the WCA, continues to make significant advances for women coaches in Japan. Both LaVoi and Masen are annual faculty members at the WeCOACH/NCAA and the Japanese Academies.
